LEARNNS/BEARS	SCHOLARSHIP POLICY
<p>Your child may be eligible to sign up for classes at no additional cost (these have been included in your monthly tuition).</p> <p>YOU MUST fill out the registration and emergency forms by the deadline in order to participate in the enrichment classes.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If your child is enrolled part-time for 3 or 4 days, they are eligible for ONE enrichment class only on the days they attend. • If your child is enrolled for full time, 5 days, they are eligible for TWO enrichment classes on any day they attend. <p>Additional classes may be taken at the fee listed. Since your child is registered with LEARNNS/BEARS, no registration fee is required. Please note all language courses count as two classes.</p>	<p>The PTA's goal is to make these classes accessible to all students in our community.</p> <p>You can apply for either <u>1 FULL</u> OR <u>1 PARTIAL SCHOLARSHIP</u>, on an honor system, based on true economic need.</p> <p>If you apply for a scholarship, you may NOT take (and pay) for another class.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Partial scholarship: One per child. REGISTRATION/PAYMENTS
<p>Registration is <u>DUE</u> January 18th. Please complete a separate form for each child.</p> <p>Return completed forms to the PTA lock box in the school office <u>OR</u> you may send it via your child's classroom teacher.</p> <p>There is one non-refundable \$15 registration fee charged per student including those receiving full or partial scholarships.</p> <p>If a class is over-enrolled, students will be selected using a lottery. Priority is given to students who signed up for and did not get into the previous session's class. If a class does not meet the minimum size to be held, we will notify you. You may either move your child to another enrichment class that meets at the same time with room available or be refunded the class fee.</p> <p>No registration will be processed without complete and timely payment.</p> <p>PLEASE MAKE YOUR CHECK PAYABLE TO <u>BAM PTA</u> (checks are deposited after the second week of classes).</p>

LATE REGISTRATION	REFUNDS
<p>Late registration is at the discretion of the enrichment coordinators. In general, late registration will be accepted during the first two weeks after the deadline, if enrichment instructor's permission is received <u>AND</u> if there is space available. Participants <u>must pay the full fee</u> for the class.</p>	<p>Once your child is admitted into a class, fees are <u>non-refundable</u> and students may not switch classes.</p>

CLASS TRANSITIONS AND SUPERVISION

Classroom teachers and enrichment instructors will assist with transitions, especially for Kindergarteners.

The enrichment teachers pick up the Kindergarteners from the Kinder Yard after dismissal. Students (1-5) will go directly to classrooms by themselves.

Both room teachers and afterschool teachers receive class rosters that aid in directing children to the correct locations. The enrichment instructors also have sign in forms to ensure children are present.

LEARNS/BEARS students must report to their after school teacher before going to their PTA Enrichment class. No supervision is provided between the end of the school day and the beginning of later time-slot Enrichment classes. Please keep this in mind if your child is not enrolled in LEARNS/BEARS.

For before school classes, parents will have to sign in students when dropping off.

PICKUP POLICY	DISCIPLINE POLICY

CLASS ENRICHMENT DESCRIPTIONS

(Please note instructors' grade limitations and different start and/or end times.)

Ceramics (K, 1-5)

This class will focus on creating objects from our world and beyond by giving students the opportunity to work in ceramics. Each unique sculpture or functional expression can be a wonderful surprise, and all levels are welcome. Because there are no wrong answers in art, the scale and style of the work is entirely open to each student's individual perception. This class is an exploration of the imagination, and will give the student a chance to build intuitively. Working in clay and glazes will also facilitate the rewarding development of fine motor skills, attention to detail, and color design. The instructor will be assisting each young artist, without interfering in their artwork, so that every student will gain firsthand knowledge of the ceramic process and how to realize their own abilities in the medium. All materials in this class are non-toxic.

Teacher Heather has 15 years of experience working with children. She received her Bachelor's in Art education from Holy Names University where she is currently the artist in residence. She has been an Art Consultant for New York City's Creative Arts Unit, taught art for the New York City Housing Authority's afterschool programs, and was the arts and crafts program leader for the City of Emeryville after school program. She currently teaches art at the Jewish Community Center of the East Bay.

Chess *New Time

Chess is a fun activity for kids of all ages. It is by far the oldest, most respected game in history and never goes "out of style." Studies have shown that it cultivates sportsmanship and mental skills, particularly in the area of problem solving, which then is reflected in improvement of school grades. Students are encouraged to think logically and creatively, while getting immediate feedback on their decision-making. The class is in a one hour format beginning with a 15 minute lesson using a large demonstration wall board. Within this lesson all aspects of chess tactics and strategy are taught over the course of a semester. The remainder of the time is devoted to students playing against each other using standard sized tournament chess sets. These games are continuously overseen for the purpose of making suggestions aimed at correcting patterns of errors and improving the student's skills. Beginners and novices receive individual attention for their particular skill level.

Larry has been conducting chess classes in the BUSD continuously since 1996. Currently he works at four elementary schools and a middle school (Willard). He has earned a National Master Certificate from the United States Chess Federation, holds a master's rating in correspondence chess, and has competed in hundreds of tournaments over a 65 year span. He is available for a first, free individual lesson for children and adults.

Choral Art (K, 1-2, 3-5)

This class will focus on tone/pitch and quality of the singing voice. It will encompass cultural and holiday songs, and learning percussion rhythms. Students will learn the joy of singing, especially for those just introduced to it. Music is traditional and simple. Music has movement and is meant to be fun. Games will be used to encourage participation. Class will include percussive instruments to establish rhythm in the body and learn how rhythm works in music. Rhythm sticks, bells, claves, triangles, maracas, sand blocks, guiros, drums will all be utilized.

Rhonda's mantra is, "No Music, No Life". She grew up in the San Francisco Bay area, and began her music study at 8 as a pianist, then on to viola at 12. At 16, she got her first job as a musician for SF's historic Third Baptist Church. In 1970, she traveled to Japan World's Fair with Lowell High Orchestra.
